HAROLD PINTER (Playwright) was born in London in 1930 and died on Christmas Eve, 2008. He wrote twenty-nine plays including The Birthday Party, The Caretaker, The Dumb Waiter, The Homecoming and Betrayal and twenty-one screenplays including Sleuth, The French Lieutenant's Woman and The Handmaid's Tale. Pinter directed twentyseven theatrical productions, including James Jovce's Exiles, David Mamet's Oleanna and many of his own plays including his last, Celebration, paired with his first, The Room at The Almeida Theatre, London in the spring of 2000. In 2005 he received the Nobel Prize for Literature. Other awards include the Companion of Honour for services to Literature, the Legion D'Honneur, the Laurence Olivier Award and the Moliere D'Honneur for lifetime achievement. "The past is what you remember, imagine you remember, convince yourself you remember, or pretend you remember."
