DIRECTOR'S NOTES – DAVID CECSARINI

Over twenty years ago when our beloved Managing Director Charles and I were busy rebuilding Next Act, we engaged a young ad firm to brainstorm on the new season's brochure. The Cedarburg duo was eager to pitch in and, after some lively discussion, submitted their ideas for the campaign. The brochure's cover would contain photos of four historical-political figures they identified as liars. Side-stepping the quibble as to how they applied the mendacity label to these four, the overall concept was clear: the ad guys' perception of the nature of theatre was... lying.

We told them they needn't develop the concept further.

This past month I was reminded, yet again, of what it's like to spend many hours in a rehearsal room with smart, passionate and committed artists, in pursuit of the truth. Beginning with text intact, each actor reads and re-reads, dissects, questions, compares notes, tests ideas, risks failure, builds confidence, works with and supports their fellows, and relentlessly pursues the author's truth in the deepest of human terms. Nothing is taken at face value, until, after examining the many possible alternatives, that's all that remains. It's a simple process; it's not magic. It is the essential process in creating theatre. And it is exhilarating.

This play is about the pursuit of truth, and its consequences. We will always have need for such plays, until the time we're ready to give up the chase. I hope I can't ever imagine such a time.

SHARR WHITE (Playwright)

Sharr White's plays have been developed or produced at theatres across the country, including MCC Theatre, South Coast Repertory, Actors Theatre of Louisville, Oregon Shakespeare Festival, Marin Theatre Company, Lincoln Center Theater's Directors Lab, Key West Theatre Festival, and more. He has been honored with a Dr. Henry and Lillian Nesburn Award as part of the Julie Harris Award in Playwriting (THE ESCAPE VELOCITY OF SAVAGES); a New York Foundation for the Arts Fellowship (SIX YEARS); and the 2009 Skye Cooper New American Play Prize (SUNLIGHT). THE OTHER PLACE received the 2010 Playwrights First Award, the 2011 Blanche and Irving Laurie Foundation's Theatre Visions Fund Award, and was an Outer Critics Circle award nominee for Outstanding New Off-Broadway Play.



TODD DENNING (Ian Smithton)

Todd is thrilled to be making his first appearance with Next Act Theatre. He lives and works in Milwaukee

as an actor, director, teacher and fight choreographer.
